Museum Hall Gallery Opening


The Holly Hill Historic Society will be celebrating its first exhibit opening in its new Hall Gallery. The Hall Gallery will be a rotating exhibit featuring a new theme of historic photographs and more. The opening will be on July 23, 2022 at IPM till 4 PM. The first exhibit is titled "Florida Flora, Landscapes and Botany". It features rare photographs of the Halifax area by Holly Hill photographer Edward G. Harris. The photos taken in the late 1800's tell the story of Florida's popularity with visitors and botanist. Over thirty beautiful framed photos will be available for order and purchase.



Henson History Revealed

Hensons' Groceries & Meats was a Holly Hill stable in the 1940's. When the current owners sandblasted the walls for repainting they uncovered the original advertisements. One feature shown besides the name was a ad promoting Borden's Dairy Products.

Located at 1116 Ridgewood. The northwest corner of LPGA. It also sold paints, beer and wine. Charles and Hazel Henson owned and operated the store till Mr. Henson's death when Hazel ran

If you have never visited them the Arches are located at 365 Calle Grande Street. Turn west off USI at the Holly Hill Publix Shopping Center and over the Railroad tracks.
