Members toured Holly Hill's first schoolhouse. The one room schoolhouse was built in 1885. Many do not know that the home next to it was the second schoolhouse built in 1888. The Society is working to have the schoolhouse, at 220 6th Street, restored and preserved. Will Harris was the first teacher. Early local development partners Benjamin Mason and Lockhart Carswell donated the property. Streets were later named after them.
